In the session 2018-19, 202 + students scored 90 percentile and above in the first level, and were selected for the second round of ASSET TALENT SEARCH EXAM.

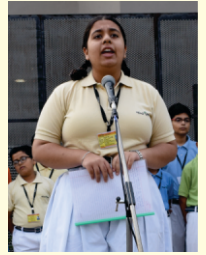
Mind Tree School has been recognised as 'THE HUB OF GIFTED STUDENTS' by ASSET organisers.

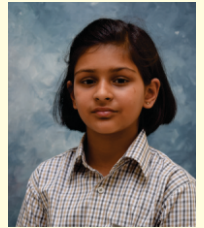
**State Level Gymnastic Championship:**
