October 29, 2022: Shaurya Chaudhary 'The Taekwondo Champion!':


"Taekwondo players don't need a weapon, they are one."

Young explorers were able to spot a few migratory birds like cranes, pelicans, geese, ducks, eagles, hawks, shanks, stints, wagtails, warblers, wheat ears, flycatchers, buntings, larks and pipits. 

The saddest word mankind knows will always be "Goodbye".


