April 09, 2024: Assembly on 'The Mystery of Bermuda Triangle' - Grade VI & VII:

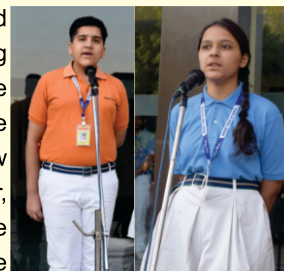
