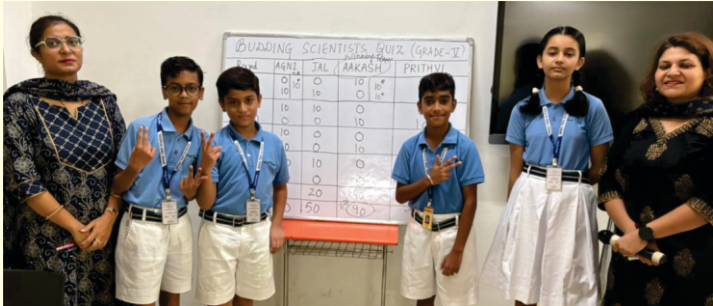
July 05, 2025: English Poem Recitation - Grade IV & V:

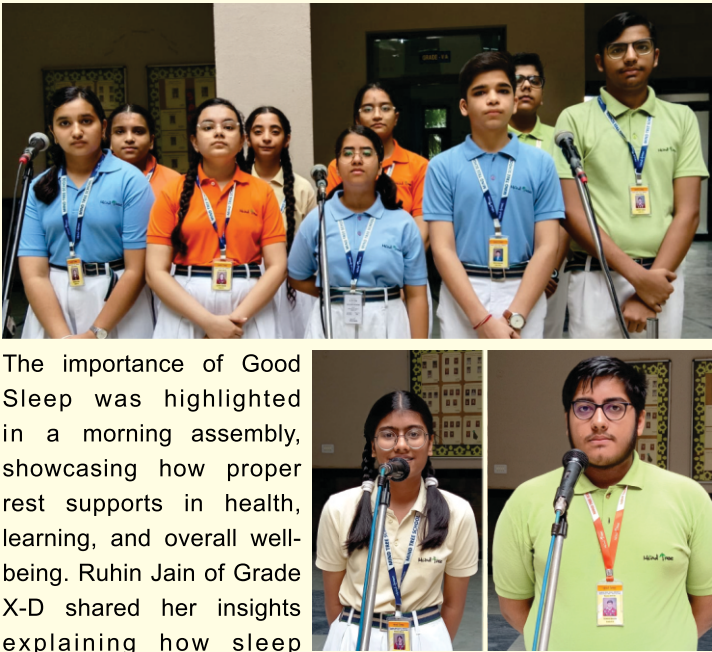
July 19, 2025: Poster Making Competition - Grade VI - VIII:

August 28, 2025: Assembly on Focusing What You Can Control- Grade IV&V:

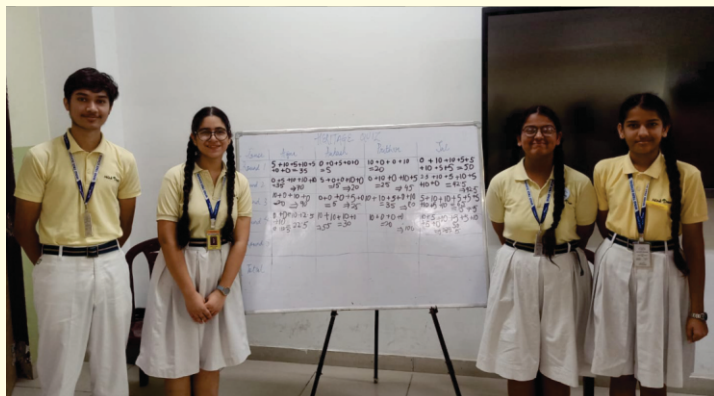

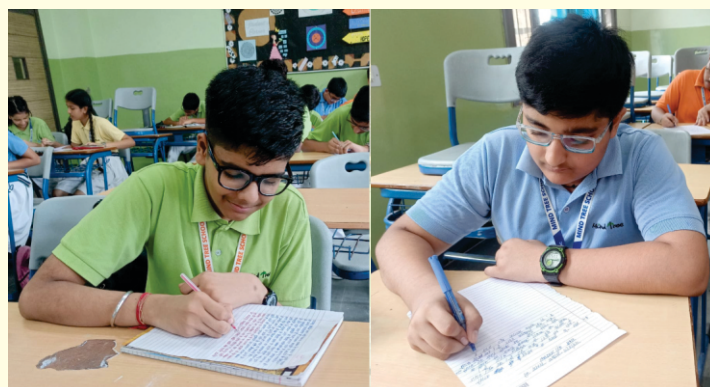

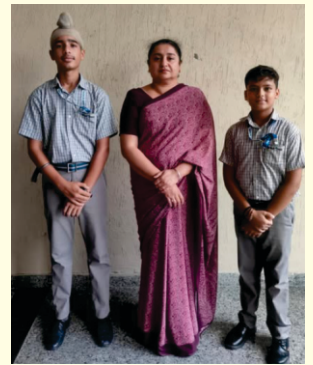
