**September 27, 2025: Diya Decoration Competition – Grade IV&V:**

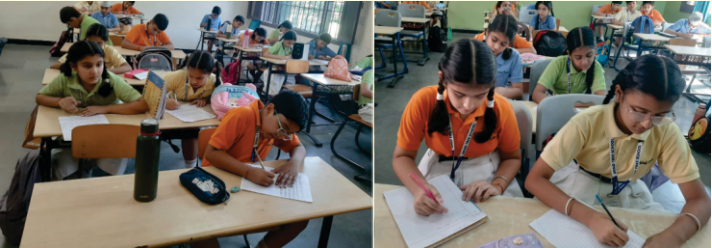

#### October 17, 2025: Special Assembly on 'Diwali' - Grade VIII - X:

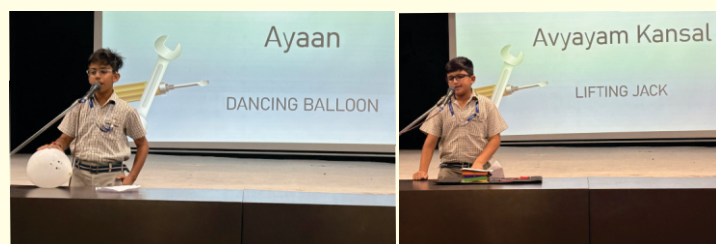

**October 29, 2025: Assembly on 'Effects of Social Media' - Grade VIII - X:**



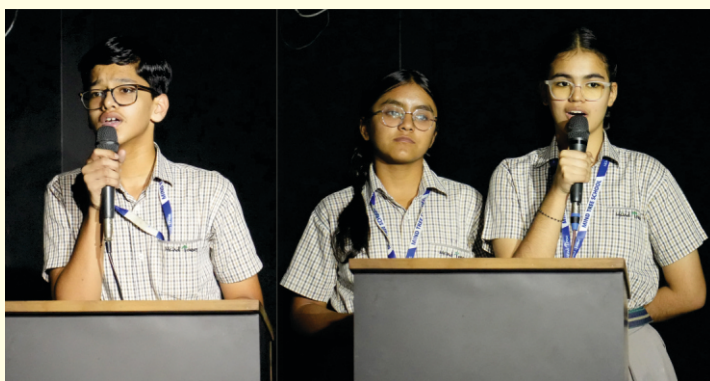

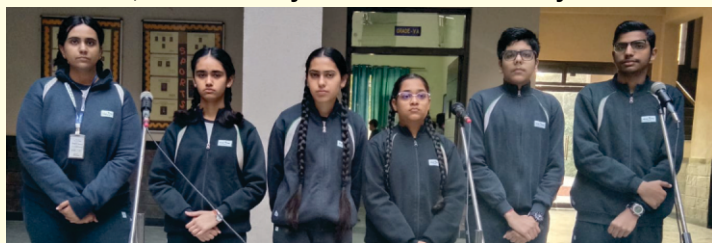
#### November 11, 2025: Assembly on 'National Education Day' - Grade VI & VII:

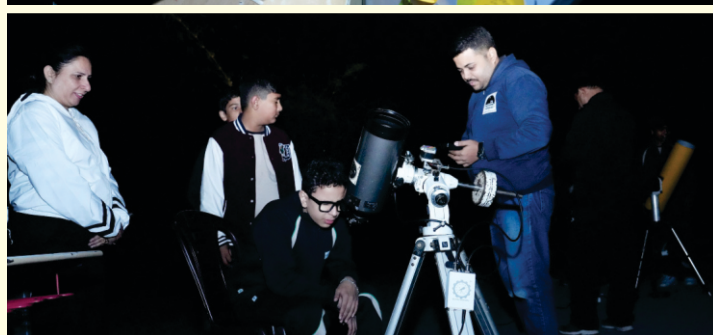
#### November 14, 2025: Special Assembly on 'Children's Day' - Grade IV & V:

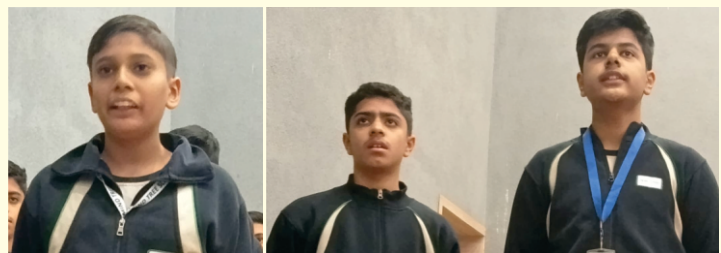
#### November 14-15, 2025: Reaching for the Stars at Mind Tree School - Grade VI - VIII:

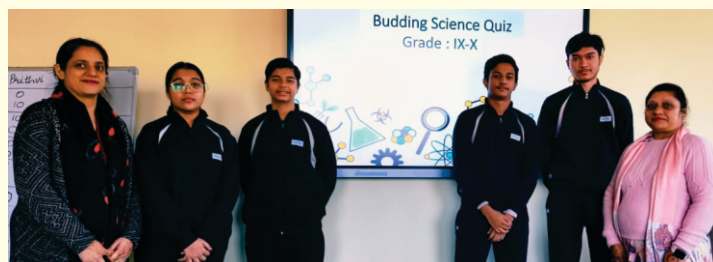

#### November 29, 2025: Kavita Path Pratiyogita (Hindi) - Grade IX & X:

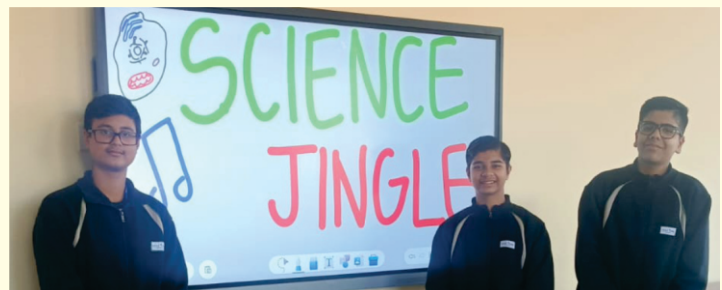

November 29, 2025: Tech Tinker Science Toy-Making Competition – Grade IV:

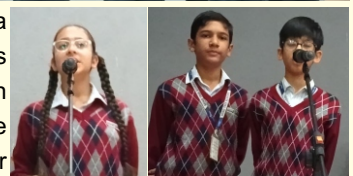

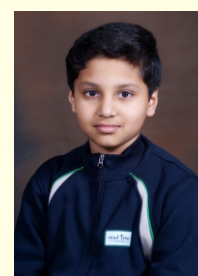

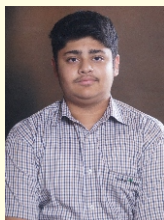
