## Theatre Club Activity- Dramatisation of 'Urubhangam':

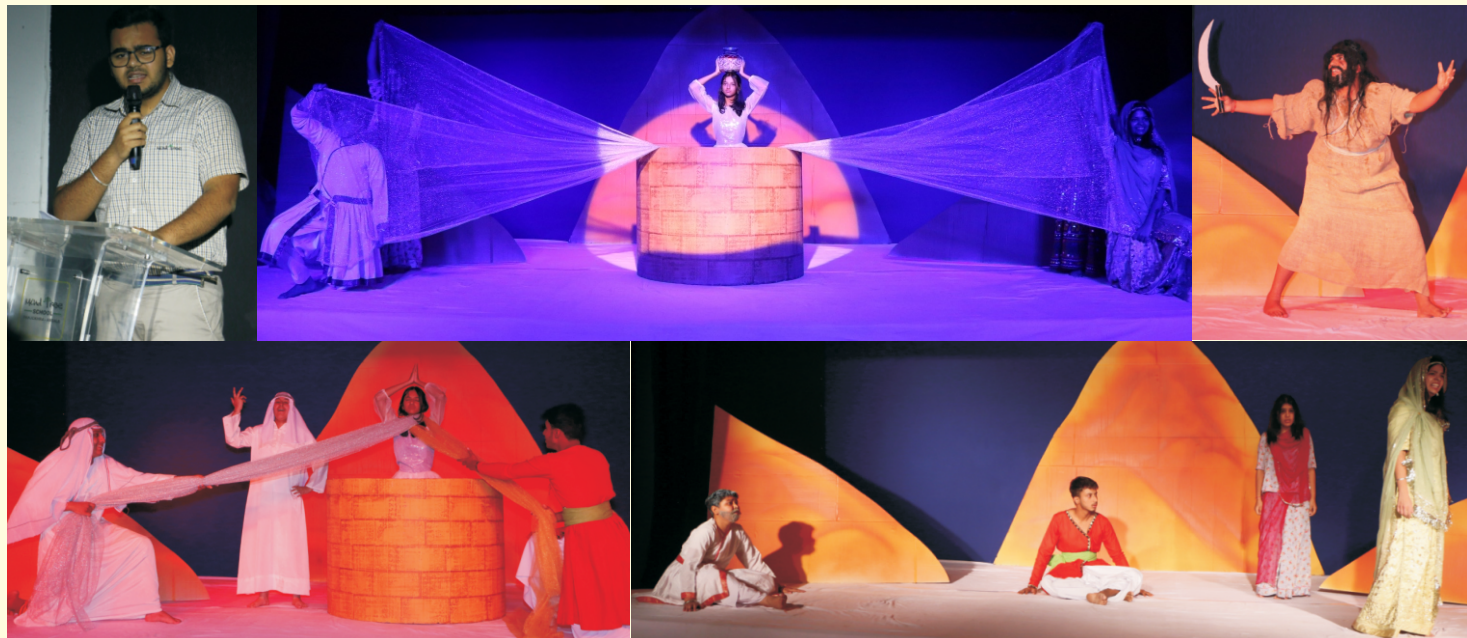
