

December 04, 2018: Assembly on Amrita Pritam:

Ikjot and Sania of Grade VI A gave an informative talk about the Padma Shri and Padma Vibhushan awardee, Amrita Pritam. She is renowned for her poetry, novel and essays in Punjabi language and is loved equally in both the countries of India and Pakistan. Her works have



been translated into several Indian and foreign languages. She became the first woman to win the Sahitya Academy Award, India's highest literary award by the Sahitya Academy.

December 12, 2018: Story Narration:

Kripa Anand and Ishika Gupta of VII C narrated an anecdote which stressed upon the judicious use of knowledge and alertness in daily life. They narrated a story of four Brahmin friends, using voice modulation and interesting expressions. The entire



assembly was impressed with the story telling ability of the students.





December 14, 2018: Assembly on 'A Day that Shook the World':

Lavanya and Yashvi of Grade VI C talked about the h o r r o r o f September 11, 2001 which saw thousands killed as the World Trade Centre in New York was brought down by the Al-Qaida



terrorists. Two out of the four hijacked airplanes crashed into the twin towers of the World Trade Centre, killing 3000 thousand people and the third airplane crashed into the Pentagon building. Lavanya and Yashvi informed that this triggered a 'War on Terror' which finally led to the elimination of Osama Bin Laden - the leader of Al-Qaida.

December 14, 2018: Talk on Brainy Dolphins:

Through his talk, Aarav of Grade V B shared with everyone fun facts about the most intelligent ocean creatures, the dolphins that are considered to be the smartest and cutest animals. The fact that intrigued us the most is that they have also been identified as one of the fewest creatures who can recognize themselves in mirrors.



December 18, 2018: Assembly on 'First Man in Space':

Samyraa Gill and Vritee Mittal of Grade VI B informed the students that on April 12, 1961, Soviet cosmonaut Yuri Alekseyevich Gagarin travelled in the spacecraft Vostok-1 and became the first human being to travel into space as well as the first one to orbit the Earth. Gagarin gained worldwide fame and recognition. After the flight, he toured Italy, Germany, the United Kingdom, Canada and Japan.



December 18, 2018: Assembly on Chernobyl Nuclear Disaster:

Ayushi and Hunar of Grade VII B talked about the horrors of the Ukraine Chernobyl Nuclear Disaster of April 1986. This catastrophe was wrought by the flawed Soviet Reactor design coupled with serious mistakes made by the plant operators. It left plumes of radioactive material which killed 50 workers on the spot, while around one lakh twenty thousand people



were evacuated from the nearby areas. The Chernobyl Disaster was an important factor in the fall of the Soviet Union.

December 18, 2018: Workshop on 'Learn How to Learn':

Mind Tree School organised an intriguing workshop which was conducted by renowned Edulogist and guided meditation expert Acharya Pawan. He shared different therapies such as Gap Therapy,



Retention Theory, and talked about the mechanics of the human brain that affect memory. He shared tips to improve concentration and focus on goals.






