They demonstrated how combining pieces of old twisted and rusty metal into a brand new work of art saves those scraps from being cast away and lost forever in junk yards and dumpsters. EDUCATORS' CORNER

August 01, 2017: Cyber Security Workshop for Teachers:



Even if you're not a tech savvy professional, it's still important that you not only are aware of the risks and threats you might face in cyberspace, but that you also take steps to protect yourself and your data. The facilitator of the workshop was **Mr. Rakshit Tandon**. He is Director Executive - Council of Information Security and Cyber Security and a consultant to Internet and Mobile Association of India. With the show of slides and interactive videos, he emphasized on the fact that just because there are risks is no reason to avoid using technology, rather he showed how we as teachers can help the students to understand the risks associated with limitless internet surfing. He emphasized that educating the students about cyber security cannot be stressed enough, because the more they know and understand about the subject, the better are their chances of staying protected. Their cyber IQ is essential to their safety and privacy on the Internet.

September 01, 2017: Teaching Strategies Workshop for Teachers:

Additionally, it assessed other factors that impact learning, including attention and social/emotional adjustment. It helped the concerned teachers to identify the problem areas of their students on which they had to emphasize.
