April 25, 2022: Best out waste - Grade I - II:

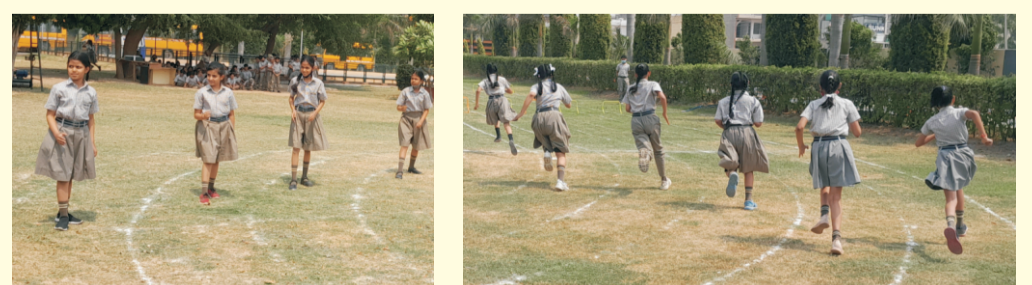
"Creativity is making marvellous out of the discarded."

Hence, it is imperative that the teacher continuously upgrades his/her knowledge and methodology in order to enhance the quality of teaching. Keeping this in mind, workshops were held in the beginning of the session to acquaint the teachers with various aspects of curriculum and the methodologies and strategies that would reap the best outcome were discussed. Various approaches to make teaching effective were enumerated in the workshop. Objectives of each grade and the learning outcome expected at the end of each grade, strategies that will help higher memory retention in students, stress on parallel evolution of languages were a few of the concerns addressed in the workshop. The teachers highly benefitted from the workshop and gained a lot of insight on the systematic approach of the curriculum.
